Winifred White Neisser SSSP Class of 1967-68

Winifred White Neisser serves as Executive Director of Angel City Chorale, an internationally recognized community choir in Los Angeles, California. Her previous career as a senior executive in Television Development, first at NBC and later at Sony Pictures Television, covered a span of 34 years. Most of her television career was focused on supervision of movies and miniseries, including the Emmy Award-winning projects, The Hatfields and The McCoys and A Raisin in the Sun. She also spent several years in Children's and Family Programs at NBC, which grew from teaching elementary school students in Boston, Massachusetts, and later in Ponce, Puerto Rico.

Neisser left Sony in 2015, accepting a fellowship at Harvard's Advanced Leadership Initiative. In 2016, she also completed the Cultural and Ethnic Arts Leadership Program at Rutgers Business School. Returning to Los Angeles, she rejoined the Angel City Chorale, as a singer and a board member before transitioning to her current role.

Neisser is a graduate of Harvard Radcliffe College with a master's in education from Lesly University and further graduate work in the School of Communications at the University of Wisconsin in Madison.

Over the years, she has served on many non-profit boards, including the Harvard University Board of Overseers, The Television Academy of Arts and Sciences Board of Governors, Planned Parenthood of Los Angeles, and the Creative Pathways Task Force through the Los Angeles County Arts Commission. She has also worked with the Inner-City Youth Orchestra of Los Angeles.

Neisser currently serves on the board of ARTS FOR LA, the Otis College of Art and Design, and the Advisory Board of the Charles Drew Medical Center.

The granddaughter of Dr. Frederick Parker, who was the mathematics instructor for the Summer Study Skills Program (SSSP), she attended the program in the summers of 1967-68.

A Virtual African American Cultural Celebration,
with Special Tribute to Benjamin Ridgeway

The Education Ministry of Hillside Presbyterian Church (USA) - Decatur, GA celebrated its annual Black History program on Saturday, February 5, 2022 at 4 p.m. This was the 12th celebration sponsored in partnership with First World Productions (Dr. Webster Wallace, Founder/Director) and the Samuel H. Johnson SSSP Foundation, Inc. This year's program was virtual once again due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The "A Charge to Keep" celebration included talented artists throughout metropolitan Atlanta and the Southeast. This year's program was dedicated in memory of Benjamin C. Ridgeway, former First Vice President of the Samuel H. Johnson SSSP Foundation Board of Directors. The program featured selections by the J.L. Roberts Men's Chorus of Ebenezer Baptist Church, Atlanta, GA (Maurice Seay, Director), as well as a selection by The Uzee Brown Society of Choraliers (Dr. Uzee Brown, Director). The video selection performed by the Choraliers, "He's Been Keeping Me," was composed by Gale Jones Murphy. It featured soloist Phillip Holley and included a montage of photos of Ben Ridgeway videotaped and edited by Al Thrash. Mr. Ridgeway was a dedicated member of both choral groups.



The Samuel H. Johnson SSSP Foundation, Inc. held its seventh spring benefit concert entitled Rhapsodies of Spring, on Sunday, June 12, 2022, at 5 p.m. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the concert was once again held virtually. Yet, the Foundation was successful in having another wonderful event that highlighted a broad area of local artists.

The legendary Mr. Larry C. Tinsley, the host of the number one Gospel Program on the airwaves in Atlanta, "Sunday Moring Praise," and "Early Morning Praise, served as the honorary chair and master of ceremony. This year's concert was held in conjunction with African American Music Appreciation Month. To honor the month and theme, our musical artists featured the talented Trey Daniels and the phenomenal Madame K.

Trey Daniels is a soloist, composer, soulful bandleader, and award-winning saxophonist. As part of eight-time Grammy award winner Anita Baker's Farewell World Tour, Daniels was featured at the Monaco Jazz Fest, North Sea Jazz Fest, and Montreux Jazz Fest. Madame K, a notable opera singer, has performed for numerous dignitaries throughout the state of Georgia, including Governor Brian Kemp and Vice President Kamala Harris.

The event also honored the 2022 Samuel H. Johnson Education Award recipients, Malcolm Mitchell and Representative "Able" Mable Thomas. Malcolm Mitchell is a 2017 Super Bowl Champion who was a wide receiver for the New England Patriots. Since its founding in 2015, his Share the Magic Foundation has placed books in the hands of more than 65,000 young readers and provided Read with Malcolm Literacy programs to over 300,000 students.

"Able" Mable Thomas has been at the forefront of fighting for freedom, justice, and equality for all Georgians and disenfranchised people worldwide for over 28 years. She has served as a state representative and as a member of the Atlanta City Council. She has been an advocate for affordable housing, women, family, and health issues, especially "reproductive justice."
